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## RESEARCH

**Access the databases** mentioned below by going to the Vincennes University home page at <http://www.vinu.edu> and clicking on Shake Library. When the library's home page comes up, you can click on Find Books or Find Articles to begin researching your topic in databases.

## INTERLIBRARY LOAN

If you find other books or articles you would like to read, contact a librarian for Interlibrary Loan, which allows books to be borrowed from other libraries at no charge to VU students, faculty and staff. Click on Find Book, the Search Other Libraries to find other library catalogs. Also, try amazon.com .

WebCat is VU's web-based library catalog. Use it to find books, videos, sound recordings, and other research items. Topics in VU WebCat pertaining to food, food history, gastronomy, cooking, and recipes include:

**food, nutrition, gastronomy, fruit, diet, cookery, dried foods, condiments, convenience foods, natural foods, smoked foods, grains, frozen foods, nuts, soyfoods, bread, milk, coffee, vegetarian cookery, pizza**

## EBSCOhost (INSPIRE) Click Find Articles

EBSCOhost (Inspire) provides access to many databases linking the user to bibliographic citations and full-text articles appearing in encyclopedias, journals, magazines, and newspapers. The **Masterfile Premier** database provides useful information for college research papers on many topics, including foods. Try specific search terms like **pizza, haggis, recipes, cookery**, etc.

## NEWSBANK Click Find Articles

TCR Database (1992-current) - This is a full-text collection of newspapers (including coverage from through the U.S.), periodicals, and other information sources.

*Indianapolis Star/News* (1993-current) - This full-text database is especially good for locating articles about Indiana events, people, and other news items. If you saw an article about food or recipes in the *Star* and you want to find it again, this is the place to try.

## SIRS KNOWLEDGE SOURCE

### Click Find Articles

This full-text research tool contains three separate databases that may be searched simultaneously. There are thousands of articles indexed under specific headings, many of which are related to food topics (try food, cookery, baking, pizza, etc.). Also available is keyword searching, which is less specific.
