Tina Miller was named Vincennes University Interim Athletic Director in the spring of 2006. She is an accomplished coach in her own right. 2008 is Tina Miller's 25th season as VU women's Volleyball coach. She is the top winner in the history of the program with 779 victories thru the 2007 season.

During her 24 seasons, the Lady Blazers have competed against both two-year schools and varsity programs from four-year colleges. She has guided the Lady Blazers to 22 or more match victories in 21 seasons and has averaged 31-plus wins a year.

Miller earned a Bachelor's Degree from Marian College in 1980 and a Master's Degree from Ball State University in 1983.
