

Commonly Asked Questions about Associate Degree Nursing

What is the deadline for applying to the program?

Applications are accepted continuously beginning September 1 until the start of the program in the Fall (August).

What kind of schedule can I expect to have?

Although student schedules are arranged on individual basis depending on the semester, most students attend full time during the day. Completion of general education courses prior to entering the program may give students a 3-4 day schedule.

Can I take night classes?

Certain general education courses may be offered at night, however there are currently no nursing courses offered in the evening.

Am I required to take a nursing entrance exam?

Vincennes University does not require prospective students to take a nursing entrance exam such as the NET test, however students are required to take the university placement exam.

How many students are accepted to the program?

The AD Nursing program generally accepts 100 students each Fall. We do keep a waiting list for the current year and accept students on the waiting list as we receive cancellations.

What is the admission process?

Applications are accepted through the Admissions Office. Once applications are complete (required documents are received, such as transcripts and test scores) files are sent for review by the Nursing Department Admissions Committee.

What is the length of the program?

Four consecutive semesters with no summer sessions required.

How do I find out if I am accepted?

An official letter of acceptance will be mailed to you from the Admissions Office.

If I have all of my general education courses completed, can I finish the program sooner?

No. Nursing courses must be completed in consecutive order for 4 semesters.

What are the NCLEX-RN licensure results for Vincennes University?

Generally, Vincennes University scores are above the national average.

Can I transfer courses from other universities?

No actual nursing courses are transferrable; however, general education courses may be transferrable. Official transcripts will have to be reviewed by the Registrar.
