Schedule and Registration Information

Classes begin January 11; semester ends May 8

I. ADVISING/REGISTRATION: Current students planning to enroll for the spring semester must have their schedules approved by their advisors. Your academic advisor will help you select your classes. Your advisor will complete your registration and provide you with a copy of your class schedule. You cannot register by phone.

Registration for current (Fall 2009) VU Jasper students begins Monday, October 26.

Registration for students not currently attending VU Jasper begins Monday, November 9.

New students will be advised and registered by admissions personnel.

ALL FINANCIAL OBLIGATIONS TO THE UNIVERSITY, INCLUDING THOSE FOR FALL 2009, MUST BE MET BEFORE REGISTRATION CAN BE COMPLETED.

II. PLACEMENT TESTING: All new students must take a placement test prior to registration. (*Transfer students may be exempt based on previous college credits. Please check with the Admissions Office.*) There is no charge for the placement testing and results are available immediately. Appointments are required for testing.

Placement testing times are Tuesdays at 9:00 a.m. and Thursdays at 1:30 p.m.

III. ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICE HOURS: Regular hours (when classes are in session)

VUJC will close at Noon on Wednesday, December 23rd.

VUJC will be closed on the following days: November 25, 26, 27 & December 24, 2009 through January 3, 2010.

IV. COST AND PAYMENT: The tuition rate is \$138.66 per credit hour (\$336.78 for non-residents of Indiana). The Student Activity Fee is \$100.00 for students enrolled in five or more hours. Bachelor degree upper level courses are \$160.15 per credit hour (\$390.52 for non-residents of Indiana). Statements will be mailed in mid-December to those who register by that time. Tuition payment is due January 4th. Students may choose an installment plan with subsequent 1/3 payments due in February and March. The installment plan requires an additional non-refundable fee of \$30.00, payable with the first installment.

Some courses have additional fees. A complete listing will be available in the Administrative Office.

Regarding REFUNDS or WITHDRAWALS refer to the University policy in the VU Jasper Catalog.

V. FINANCIAL AID: The 2009-10 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) should be on file in order to determine eligibility for Pell Grants, State grant programs and student loans. Students may apply financial aid toward tuition costs provided all financial aid processing is complete.

VI. TEXTBOOKS: Textbooks will be available for purchase beginning Monday, January 4th. The VUJC Bookstore is located in the lower level of the Administration Building. Bookstore hours are 8:00 a.m. – 4:30 p.m. January 4, 6, 7, 8. The bookstore will be open 8:00 a.m. – 6:30 p.m. January 5th and 9:00 a.m. – Noon on Saturday, January 9th. FAST PASS Book Vouchers for financial aid recipients will be available beginning Thursday, January 7th.
