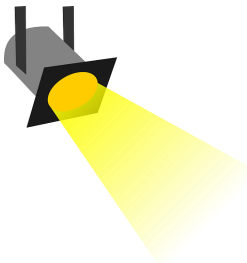
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A note from the Director– Nick Palmer

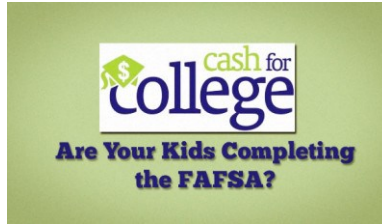
ETS Alumni Spotlight — Clint Roesler

- The new 2020–21 FAFSA form is here! Some states and schools have limited funds, so don't delay! To begin your application, select the **"START HERE"** button on the FAFSA homepage or download the **myStudentAid app** for iOS and Android.
- Students who are using an Apple device (mobile and/or desktop) may encounter errors on some FAFSA fields if the "smart punctuation" feature is enabled. This feature changes apostrophes and quotation marks to invalid characters that the FAFSA form cannot recognize. **Learn about solutions for this error.**
- Check out the **myStudentAid app** for iOS and Android.
- To get the best experience, **make sure your browser's pop-up blocker allows pop-ups** from fafsa.ed.gov before logging in to the FAFSA form.

STATE DEADLINES:

ASAP After Oct. 1, 2019

Adult Student Grant: As soon as possible after Oct. 1, 2019. Awards are made until funds are depleted. New applicants must submit additional forms at ScholarTrack.IN.gov.

Workforce Ready Grant: As soon as possible after Oct. 1, 2019.

Frank O'Bannon Grant: April 15, 2020, by midnight Central time (CT).

21st Century Scholarship: April 15, 2020, by midnight CT.

The Indiana TRIO Board of Directors has established a variety of scholarships to help finance higher education for Indiana first-generation, low-income, or students with disabilities who are active in Indiana TRIO programs. Scholarships are awarded annually to students based on community involvement, need, and their ability to articulate how TRIO has made a difference in their educational journey.

To apply students must complete the Indiana TRIO Scholarship Application Form; submit a referral form from a TRIO Director or TRIO Staff Member, and write a two-page maximum narrative addressing points specific to each scholarship. Some additional materials may be requested depending on the scholarship. All submissions must be made through the student's TRIO Program Director and **submitted by March 27, 2020** for consideration. Incomplete and/or late submissions will not be considered. Scholarships will be paid directly to the student after verification of enrollment and attendance at the University of their Choice in early September 2020. Study abroad scholarships will be paid upon verification of enrollment in an approved study abroad program, payable in May 2020. All checks will be made payable to the student and must be sent to the student's current address at time of payment. All Scholarships require an essay: double-spaced and not to exceed two pages describing: 1) How TRIO has influenced your educational journey 2) why the Indiana TRIO BOD scholarship is important to you and 3) community/co-curricular involvement and/or responsibilities outside of school. Vincennes University is a public university with its main campus in Vincennes, Indiana. Founded in 1801 as Jefferson Academy, VU is the oldest public institution of higher learning in the Northwest Territory and in Indiana. VU was chartered in 1806 as the Indiana Territory's four-year university and remained the state of Indiana's sole publicly funded four-year university until the establishment of Indiana University in 1820. In 1889, VU was chartered by the State of Indiana as a two-year university. From 1999 to 2005, Vincennes University was in a state-mandated partnership with what became the Ivy Tech Community College. In 2005, VU began offering baccalaureate degrees.

What Software Developers Do

Software developers create the applications or systems that run on a computer or another device.

Work Environment

Many software developers work for firms that deal in computer systems design and related services, manufacturing, or for software publishers.

How to Become a Software Developer

Software developers usually have a bachelor's degree in computer science and strong computer programming skills.

Pay

The median annual wage for software developers, applications was \$103,620 in May 2018.

The median annual wage for software developers, systems software was \$110,000 in May 2018.

Job Outlook

Employment of software developers is projected to grow 21 percent from 2018 to 2028, much faster than the average for all occupations. Software developers will be needed to respond to an increased demand for computer software
